Course Registration

Members of Marching Mizzou **must enroll** in either course MUS_ENS 1841, Section 12, Class #53947, for credit, or MUS_ENS 1841, Section 14, Class #54244, for zero-credit (out-of-state students only), to participate in Marching Mizzou. Permission to enroll in Marching Mizzou is granted upon official acceptance and completed internally by the School of Music. This permission is granted for Section 12 only so if you are an out-of-state student, please request assistance from **Susan Worstell**, Administrative Assistant for Current and Prospective Student Support, via [form](#) and she will switch your permission to Section 14. You no longer need a permission number to register for the course due to this internal permissions system, so you should be able to add it to your schedule in MyZou without issue. If, however, you do encounter an issue when you attempt to register for Marching Mizzou through your MyZou account, please submit any permission requests/questions (including schedule conflicts) through this [form](#) for resolution by **Susan Worstell** in the School of Music.

Students not enrolled in Marching Mizzou will NOT be allowed to perform at our first game on Thursday, August 29, unless permission is granted by the band faculty, so please complete your enrollment as soon as possible.

Fall Semester Rehearsal Schedule

Fall semester rehearsals take place every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and selected Fridays from 4:15 – 6:00 PM. (Color Guard and Drumline rehearse from 4:00 PM – 6:00 PM). Traditionally, we will not meet as a class on Friday if we do not have a performance commitment on Saturday, but only if that time off is **earned**. We will, however, **NOT** meet as a class on the following dates so you can plan on these at this time:

- Friday, August 30 (Day after First Home Game)
- Friday, September 27
- Friday, October 4 (*Potential* Mini Mizzou Away Trip to Texas A&M)
- Friday, October 25 (Mini Mizzou to Alabama)
- Friday, November 1

- Friday, November 15 (Marching Mizzou Drumline to PASIC and BOA)
- Friday, November 22 (Going into Thanksgiving Break, but note our last home game is Saturday, 11/30)

Additionally, every section of the band may have an additional individual sectional each week as determined by your section leaders. Each section will determine its own sectional day(s), but all are required to take place at the Marching Mizzou Practice Field.

Finally, the **posting of all music, important documents, announcements, and grades is done on our course site through Canvas, so you must enroll PRIOR to the start of band camp to be able to access these materials.**

Insurance

Per University of Missouri Risk and Insurance Management, all Marching Mizzou members are **encouraged** to provide proof of insurance prior to the start of any Marching Mizzou related activity. Please provide this requested information on the **Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form** as we will keep it on file in the School of Music in the event you require medical attention. If you do not have health insurance, student insurance is available through the Student Health Center via the university-sponsored Anthem Student Health Insurance plans. If this isn't possible, self-paying students are given a **substantial discount** by University Physicians that is applied toward their bill.

Marching Mizzou Summer Informational Zoom Sessions

Starting in June of 2020 we hosted Marching Mizzou Summer Informational Zoom Sessions for our members to help prepare our membership for band camp in August and the upcoming fall semester. We plan to continue that this year for Band 139 and present them as an overall summer curriculum that will set you up for successful membership in Marching Mizzou.

These sessions are optional, but we highly encourage you to attend as many sessions as your summer schedule will allow because each session will be beneficial to your preparations for Marching Mizzou, give you the opportunity to learn more about our program, address any questions or concerns you may have, and most importantly, provide a chance for you to get to know your fellow band family members. While these sessions are specifically designed for New Members, Returning Members are welcomed and encouraged to attend as well.

The start time for each session will be **4:15 PM CST** (the same time we start class during the fall semester) and will last approximately one hour.

Band Camp Arrival & Tentative Schedule

Monday, August 12	Returning Members, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM (Option 2) <i>Please proceed directly to your assigned residence hall at your selected move-in time slot.</i>

*Please arrange your own housing on Friday as the residence halls do not open until Saturday, August 10.

As indicated above if you are on a fall residence hall contract there are two options to move in depending on your sub-group of Marching Mizzou, either Saturday, Sunday, or Monday, August 10-12. Further information about this move-in process can be found on page 15 of this newsletter.

Band Camp is **REQUIRED** for participation in Marching Mizzou so please read the Band Camp schedule carefully and prepare yourself accordingly for all scheduled events that week. Please notify Dr. Knopps at knoppsa@missouri.edu if you are marching with DCI (Drum Corps International) this summer so we can note that and plan for your late arrival once DCI Finals and your final responsibilities with your associated corps conclude. All members are expected to be in attendance **as soon as possible** following the completion of their responsibilities with DCI.

If you are participating in **PHA Recruitment**, which runs concurrently with our Band Camp, we will work with you to balance your responsibilities with both PHA Recruitment and Marching Mizzou. Please indicate on your **Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form** if you are participating in PHA Recruitment.

Note Marching Mizzou is an academic class that requires considerations over non-academic activities; however, we feel involvement in Greek Life is important and adds to the overall college experience. We will continue to work with you throughout the week, so you are able to balance both items in a healthy manner, but when in the academic semester, Marching Mizzou must take priority over your non-academic activities related to Greek Life.

As you think ahead to your band camp arrival, please prepare yourself for what will likely be another hot and humid mid-Missouri summer. If you will be working or residing indoors for most of your time this summer, you need to acclimate yourself to the Missouri heat and humidity so please spend some time outdoors in the weeks leading up to Band Camp. Additionally, please continue to drink water so your body is hydrated and ready for work in this setting.

A great resource to prepare your body physically for band camp is “Marching Health,” an entity we have partnered with for the last two seasons and will again this year with Band 139. In preparation for Band Camp, we will complete their “Back to Band” Workout. This is a six-week, six workout curricula, presented by our Marching Mizzou Health and Wellness Committee. This recommended workout plan will run from **Sunday, June 30-Saturday, August 10** and will progressively build until the start of our band camp. The workouts will be distributed via a weekly announcement with descriptions of the structure and proper execution of the workouts as well as video demonstrations. Each workout will be recommended to be completed three times a week, with one

rest day in between. You can preview this workout via the Marching Health channel on YouTube linked [here](#).

Finally, new this year is a charge from our newly established “Marching Mizzou Health and Wellness Committee.” The committee co-chairs, Audrey Shaw and Hannah Wehrman developed a “Marching Mizzou Summer Cardio Contest” to complement the Marching Health “Back to Band” Workout so you can diversify your health and fitness options. This comes with a section challenge element that ties into our annual Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Week and Cup Competition, so please see the message below from Audrey and Hannah:

Hello, Marching Mizzou!

We are so excited to begin and co-chair the new Marching Mizzou Health and Wellness Committee! Thank you to Dr. Knopps and the Drum Majors for supporting this idea, as we are thrilled to begin great things with this new committee. We have a lot of ideas for this season, but the first we are most excited about is our Marching Mizzou Summer Cardio Competition!

It is important for us as individuals and an ensemble to be prepared for Band 139, both physically and mentally. This preparation needs to begin before band camp so that we can be in optimal shape prior to our performances rather than mid-season. Although not everyone finds exercise fun, and that’s okay, we have created some motivation to join our summer cardio competition . . . Spirit Cup points. That’s right, with approval from Dr. Knopps and Drum Major Brady Sohn, our Marching Mizzou Recruitment and Outreach Committee Chair, this contest gives your section the chance to earn points towards the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Cup before band camp even begins!

Your Marching Mizzou Leadership Team Member has been given the full details of this competition, including the timeline and point system, but below are a few highlights:

The Marching Mizzou Summer Cardio Competition will take place over ten weeks, starting on **June 2**. June 2-8th will be a test week to allow for any adjustments to be made. The first day of awarding points will be on **June 9th** and the last day, **August 10th**.

The contest will be monitored through our “Marching Mizzou Club” on the Strava App, housed on your mobile device. Strava is free to download, although it does have an option to upgrade at a cost. The upgrade, however, is not necessary as the competition can be completed with the free version of the app. Strava functions like social media where you make a post after doing an exercise.

After downloading the app, please use our Marching Mizzou Club Link to accept the invitation to join. We encourage you to make sure your profile account has your real name so we can contribute the appropriate points to your section of Marching Mizzou.

In the “Activities” section of our club, it will show what other members of our club have been doing to be active. We will be using our club posts to keep track of each person's completion of the activities to earn points. Points will not be counted unless you are in our club. We ask that when you join, you give a brief introduction, so we can all get to know each other and begin to bond together as a band family. At the end of each week, we will send point updates to the Marching Mizzou Leadership Team, so everyone is aware of the standings throughout the competition. Points are awarded based on the percent of your section that participates so encourage your fellow band family members to join and participate in this competition. Extra spirit points are on the line for your section that could make the difference come August when the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Cup is awarded!

Every week will include x minutes of cardio of your choice and x section(s) of the week’s “Back to Band” exercises (including any repeats in the back to band instructions) as noted in the challenge chart below. The x’s represent numbers that will change each week in small increments to ensure a safe but effective buildup in activity to band camp. You can do any of the cardio options available to log your cardio, and please use the “HIIT” category to log your Back-to-Band participation. BOTH must be visible in our club’s “Activities” section to be counted as a completion. Note any exercise that gets your heart rate up will be counted, if it meets the time requirement. Running, walking, lifting, biking, swimming, whatever your preferred exercise is - go for it, and again it must be logged in our group on the Strava application to count.

Week Number	Complete this Challenge to Earn Points
1 (<i>practice week, no points awarded</i>)	
2	15 minutes of exercise
3	20 minutes of exercise
4	25 minutes of exercise
5	30 minutes of cardio and 1 section of the current back to band exercises
6	40 minutes of cardio and 2 sections of the current back to band exercises
7	40 minutes of cardio and 3 sections of the current back to band exercises
8	40 minutes of cardio and 4 sections of the current back to band exercises
9	40 minutes of cardio and all sections of the current back to band exercises
10	40 minutes of cardio and all sections of the current back to band exercises

Finally, below is how to log your activity in the Strava app:

1. Open the Strava App
2. Hit “record” in the center of the bottom task bar
3. Hit “start”
4. Do your activity, whatever it may be
5. Hit “finish” to complete the workout
6. Type your activity in the title bar

7. Type your section in the “How’d it go?” box
8. Click the dropdown menu and select what exercise you did for your cardio OR scroll down and select “HIIT” if you are logging your Back-to-Band exercise
 - Reminder that BOTH parts of the challenge need to be completed to count for points!
 - We suggest recording your cardio separately from the HIIT/back-to-band workout so we can verify the record of both being completed.
9. Hit “save activity” to post your completed workout

Residence Hall Move-In Process

If you have signed a residence hall contract for the fall, **you need to provide the requested information on the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form** so the School of Music can communicate to Residential Life that you are a member of Marching Mizzou and will need an early move-in time.

There are two options to move into your residence hall this year for each sub-group of Marching Mizzou:

- Saturday, August 10 Leadership Team, Drumline, Color Guard, Feature Twirlers, and New Members (Option 1)
- Sunday, August 11 Drumline, Color Guard, Feature Twirlers, and New Members (Option 2)
 Returning Members, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM (Option 1)
- Monday, August 12 Returning Members, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM (Option 2)

All **Leadership Team, New Members, Drumline, Color Guard, and Feature Twirlers members** may move into their Residence Hall either Saturday, August 10 or Sunday, August 11. We strongly recommend all Drumline, Color Guard, Feature Twirlers, and New Members select a move-in slot prior to your first rehearsal at 1:30 PM on Sunday, August 11. All **Returning Members** may move into their Residence Hall either Sunday, August 11 or Monday, August 12. We strongly recommend all Returning Members select a move-in slot prior to camp registration at 1:00 PM on Monday, August 12. You will go directly to your assigned residence hall at your selected move-in time slot. Residential Life will have volunteers and staff available to assist with early move-in only on Saturday, August 10.

The Residential Life housing portal will open in early July. **Please submit your Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form by June 20.** This will allow us time to communicate your early move-in request to Residential Life for your individual registration portal to be updated with early move-in options as soon as the housing portal opens. You will receive more information about the move-in time sign-up process in emails directly from Residential Life and via housing.missouri.edu/moving-to-mizzou. If somehow when you attempt to register all slots are filled or if you have any issues with this early move-in process, please let us know by emailing mubands@missouri.edu.

We will continue to send new registrations weekly on Tuesday mornings until July 30 so your Residential Life registration portal can be updated with early move-in times by Wednesday. If you complete the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form after the Residential Life housing portal opens, you will need to wait until Wednesday of the following week to register through Residential Life for an early move-in slot. **Your Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form must be submitted NO LATER than Monday, July 29** for us to arrange early move-in with Residential Life. As a reminder, if you do not complete your Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form with this information, we cannot reserve and subsidize your early residence hall move-in.

University-Owned Instruments

Every instrumentalist of Marching Mizzou will be provided with a university-owned instrument and one pair of black practice gloves that alto saxophone, tenor saxophone, and brass members are required to wear at all rehearsals.

Woodwind and brass members *are allowed* and encouraged to utilize their own instrument, especially clarinets, instead of one issued to them; however, the instrument must match the instrument provided by University Bands. For example, only silver instruments are used, except for black clarinets. Marching Mizzou is **NOT** responsible for cleaning, refurbishing, or replacing your personal instrument so you utilize it at your own risk. If you choose to utilize your own instrument you will be required to wear practice gloves at rehearsal.

After exhausting your provided pair of gloves, students must purchase replacement black gloves via our Marching Mizzou Uniform Store. In addition, Marching Mizzou does **NOT** furnish nor sell reeds, valve oil, or grease, so please come prepared with those items as needed for your instrument.

This summer all instruments have been professionally cleaned. **To reserve an instrument please indicate what you need on the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form.** If you need to adjust your registration form, please

email us at mubands@missouri.edu. You do **NOT** need to fill out a separate School of Music Instrument Request Form as all your information has been captured in our [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#).

Marching Mizzou Traditional Music

Woodwind and brass members please be thinking about which part will best fit your playing ability and communicate this to your respective Section Leaders. Returning members, you may be assigned to the same part as last season, but may be asked to move to a new part to help balance the section.

Marching Mizzou Cost Coverage & Ultimate Drill Book Application Use

Marching Mizzou covers the cost of your instruments/equipment, one pair of black practice gloves, one pair of black performance gloves, music, and access to music and drill charts (via the [Ultimate Drill Book App](#)), game day meals, uniform cleaning costs, official game travel, and our annual end of season Band Banquet. All members, however, must purchase their own marching shoes (\$43.00) (Winds and Drumline; Color Guard priced separately) **and any replacement clothing and equipment items that may be needed**. Students are financially responsible for any damaged or lost instruments, uniforms, and/or equipment.

Marching Mizzou memorizes their music for performances along a parade route and on Faurot Field in Memorial Stadium. We do use music, however, in rehearsal and in the stands at games for music. This year we will be continuing our use of an electronic application, but it will be Ultimate Drill Book’s “Beam” application so both your music and drill is housed within one application. All wind players will be issued equipment to hold their phone (like a lyre) at the beginning of the season along with their instrument. **If you do not have a smartphone for this application, a flip folder will be provided to you.**

Marching Mizzou Fundamentals Video Series

As you are preparing musically for our season, please also prepare visually by viewing our Marching Mizzou Fundamentals Video Playlist updated by Drum Major of Band 136-7 Alex Weinzierl, Kristine Malone, and members of our Marching Mizzou Musicianship and Movement Committee from Band 137, then updated by Drum Major of Band 137-38 Cooper Gibbs and Ethan Gray, Drumline Section Leader of Band 138. This video will break down our entire visual package as well as go over rehearsal etiquette to prepare yourself for our classroom environment.

Marching Mizzou Shirts, Ball Caps, Sunglasses, and Water Bottles

All **NEW Marching Mizzou members** will receive a Marching Mizzou black polo (available in both feminine and masculine cuts), gold dri-fit t-shirt (to wear underneath our uniform), white rehearsal shirt (worn on Thursdays), gold rehearsal shirt (worn on Game Day Eve Fridays), black rehearsal shorts (worn on Thursdays), Nike Athletic Shoes, ball cap, winter hat, sunglasses, and a water bottle at **NO CHARGE**. These items are yours to keep for the duration of your time in Marching Mizzou, but if at any time you lose one of these items you must purchase a

replacement item via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Returning Members will receive a new (same design) white t-shirt at **NO CHARGE**. The Marching Mizzou black polo, ball cap, winter hat, gold dri-fit t-shirt, water bottle, and sunglasses have remained the same; therefore, you will not receive these new items, please bring these back with you to campus. You may, however, purchase these items if any of yours need to be replaced via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#). We do have a new feminine cut rehearsal short so if you are interested in purchasing a pair of those, please be sure to complete the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) with needed sizes and for other replacement items **before** paying for these items via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Ball caps will be used in the stands during games and used as an official uniform piece; therefore, all ball caps **must be treated as part of your uniform** and remain with you during all performances. In the event of cold weather an official Marching Mizzou winter hat will be issued and utilized in the stands as an official uniform piece. Color Guard and Feature Twirlers, you will be issued a headband. It is required that all members (except Color Guard and Feature Twirlers) wear their Marching Mizzou official dri-fit t-shirt under their uniform at every performance to present a uniform appearance when uniform coats are removed.

Our “Casual Uniform” for Marching Mizzou consists of the Marching Mizzou black polo, ball cap, a pair of LONG khaki-colored shorts or pants (purchase on own), black belt (as needed), and Nike athletic shoes to be worn with **black ankle socks**. As discussed, this is to create a sharp, uniform look across the ensemble during performances, travel, etc. Alternatively, throughout the rest of the season in the event of extreme temperatures for the comfort and safety of our students, we utilize this uniform as an alternative to the formal Marching Mizzou uniform. We will wear this casual uniform right away at Concert on the Quad on Sunday, August 18, so please make sure you have purchased your **long khaki shorts AND black ankle socks AND a black belt** prior to the start of band camp.

Uniform Fitting, Check Out, and Shoes

Marching Mizzou Uniform fitting will first take place virtually again this year by our Uniform Committee and Tau Beta Sigma Uniform Chairs. This will allow us to assign uniforms in advance to minimize the time of the in-person fitting process.

If you are a new woodwind, brass, or drumline member, or a Returning Member who has changed sizes, please complete the following Google Form so our Uniform Chairs may collect your information and make an initial uniform assignment **as soon as possible**. Prior to filling out this Google Form, please watch [this video](#) so you can complete your measurements correctly.

Marching Mizzou Uniform Fitting Google Form for Tau Beta Sigma

Once all assignments have been completed, we will utilize the uniform fitting schedule indicated on the band camp schedule so members may try on their assigned uniform. If any adjustments need to be made to your assigned uniform, we will assign you an alternate uniform. In addition to your assigned uniform, all woodwind and brass players must wear black gloves (provided).

Marching Mizzou will continue to utilize the black “Super Drillmasters” that match our new uniforms and provide extended comfort to our members. To match the clean and sharp appearance of our uniforms and for uniformity across the ensemble, all wind and drumline members of Marching Mizzou must wear Super Drillmasters. The \$43.00 price has been made available exclusively to Marching Mizzou through Stanbury Uniforms (the manufacturer of our uniforms). New members, if this was the shoe you utilized in a previous ensemble, and they are still in good condition you can continue to use them in Marching Mizzou. Note that all wind and drumline members must wear **long black athletic socks** (absolutely NO ankle socks nor long black athletic socks with **any** logos) with their band shoes. Please complete payment for these shoes via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Parking at the Marching Mizzou Practice Field

All members and staff of Marching Mizzou must ensure their car is properly registered with Parking and Transportation Services (Turner Avenue Garage, Level 2, 882-4568).

Dr. Zambito has worked with Parking and Transportation to secure more parking spaces in the areas adjacent to the Marching Mizzou Practice Field. We are still permitted to use spillover lot across from Champions Drive if our Lot N and Little N is full.

If you live **on campus** and plan to purchase a permit to park on campus overnight as a resident student, you will need to provide Marching Mizzou with car information to allow you to park in the lots adjacent to our Marching Mizzou Practice Field.

If you plan to live **off campus** and need to park at the band field just for practice, you will be able to do so by purchasing a Fall 2024 Permit.

There is no plan by Parking and Transportation to ticket during Band Camp so you can park in our lots, as well as the Turner Avenue Parking Garage, without violation.

For Game Days one carpool will be provided at Lot N parking pass free of charge from Mizzou Athletics. The Hearnes Center bus stop is very close to the Marching Mizzou Practice Field so students can utilize that to transition to the field. There are also bike racks available adjacent to our Marching Mizzou storage shed for use if students choose to ride their bike.

Mini Mizzou

Mini Mizzou represents the absolute best instrumentalists from Marching Mizzou. It is the athletic pep band that performs at selected away football games, all home men's and women's basketball games as well as select home volleyball matches, in addition to post season travel at the SEC and NCAA levels for all three teams, and various other athletic and campus events as requested and approved by Dr. Amy M. Knopps, Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands. All travel is paid for by the University of Missouri or the NCAA.

Mini Mizzou is split evenly to form the Mini Mizzou Black Band and the Mini Mizzou Gold Band that rotates performance responsibilities for Away Games for Football, Volleyball, Men's Basketball and Women's Basketball, as well as other campus and community events.

Membership is open to all members of Marching Mizzou, regardless of seniority or experience. **Video auditions for Mini Mizzou** will consist of "Fight Tiger" (memorized) and "Give a Cheer" and due to Dr. Knopps by **Friday, August 23** at the end of the first week of classes. Every member is strongly encouraged to audition for this special group, even if just for substitute consideration. Drum set auditions will be facilitated by Dr. Zambito, Assistant Director of Athletic Bands, and require additional audition material which he will outline to all interested candidates during band camp.

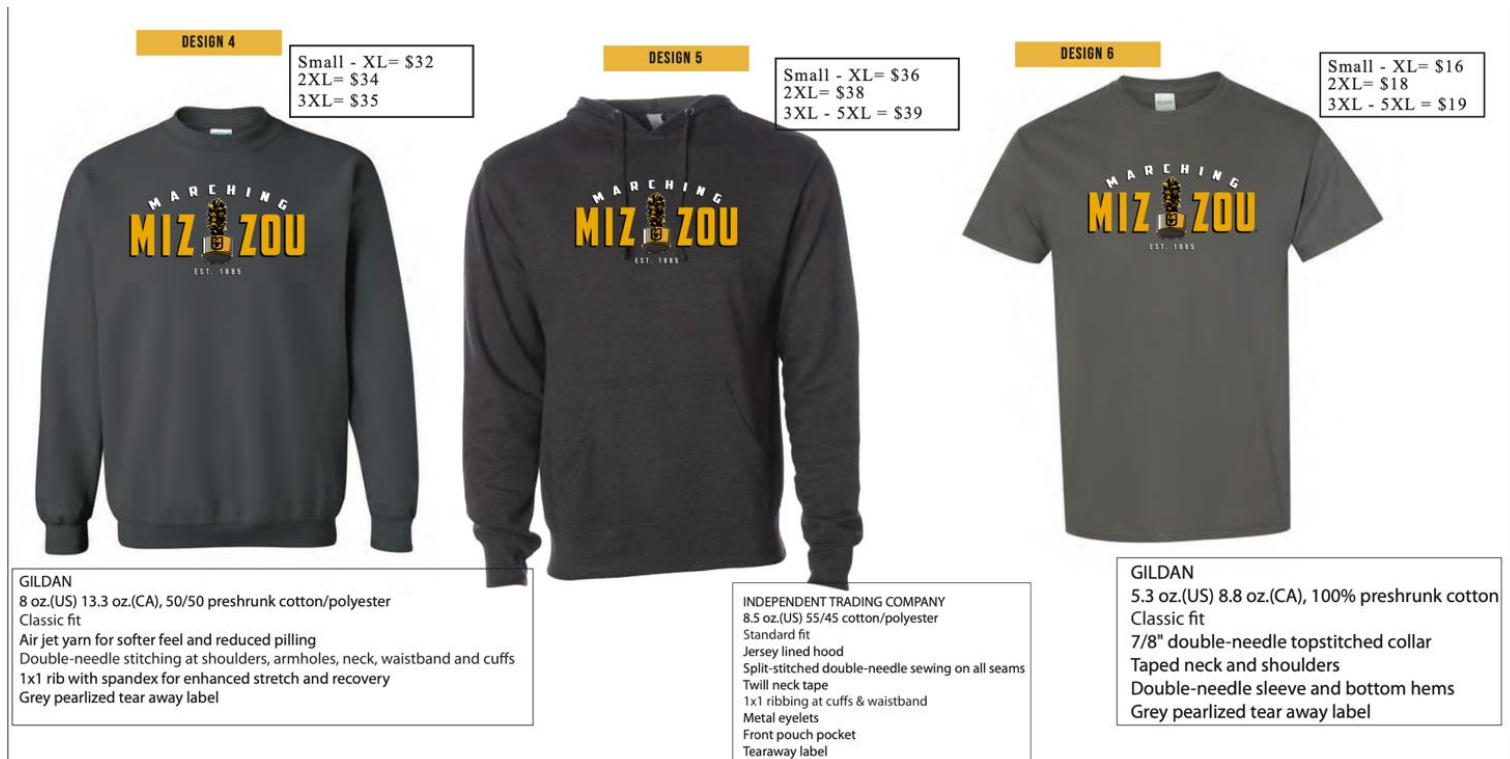
