Course Registration

Members of Marching Mizzou **must enroll** in course MUS_ENS 1841, Section 12, Class #53947 to participate in Marching Mizzou.

Permission to enroll in Marching Mizzou is granted upon official acceptance and completed internally by the School of Music. You do not need a permission number to register for the course due to this internal permissions system, so you should be able to add it to your schedule in MyZou without issue. If, however, you do encounter an issue when you attempt to register for Marching Mizzou through your MyZou account, please submit any permission requests/questions (including schedule conflicts) through the [Music Registration Assistance Request Form](#) for resolution by Susan Worstell in the School of Music. Please note that zero-credit courses in the School of Music are not currently offered and are under review. If you are an out-of-state student and have concerns regarding the Marching Mizzou course to be taken for credit, please indicate this on the [Music Registration Assistance Request Form](#), question #14.

The posting of all music, important documents, announcements, and grades is done on our course site through Canvas, so you must enroll minimally **PRIOR** to the start of band camp to be able to access these materials. The Band 140 Canvas page for Marching Mizzou will go live no later than July 1.

Students not enrolled in Marching Mizzou will **NOT** be allowed to perform at our first game on Thursday, August 28, unless permission is granted by the band faculty, so please complete your enrollment as soon as possible.

Fall Semester Rehearsal Schedule

Fall semester rehearsals take place every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and selected Fridays from 4:15 – 6:00 PM. (Color Guard and Drumline rehearse from 4:00 PM – 6:00 PM). Traditionally, we will not meet as a class on Friday if we do not have a performance commitment on Saturday, but only if that time off is **earned**.

We will, however, **NOT** meet as a class on the following dates so you can plan on these at this time:

- Friday, August 29 (Day after First Home Game)
- Friday, October 3
- Friday, October 17 (Mini Mizzou Gold Band to Auburn)
- Friday, October 24 (Mini Mizzou Black Band to Vanderbilt)
- Friday, October 31
- Friday, November 21 (Going into Thanksgiving Break)

Additionally, every section of the band may have an additional individual sectional each week as determined by your section leaders. Each section will determine its own sectional day(s), but all are required to take place at the Marching Mizzou Practice Field.

Insurance

Per University of Missouri Risk and Insurance Management, all Marching Mizzou members are encouraged to provide proof of insurance prior to the start of any Marching Mizzou related activity. Please provide this requested information on the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) as we will keep it on file in the School of Music in the event you require medical attention. If you do not have health insurance, student insurance is available through the Student Health Center via a student health insurance provider.

Marching Mizzou Summer Informational Zoom Sessions

Monday, August 18	Returning Members, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM (Option 2) <i>Please proceed directly to your assigned residence hall at your selected move-in time slot.</i>

*Please arrange your own housing on Friday as the residence halls do not open until Saturday, August 16.

As indicated above if you are on a fall residence hall contract there are two options to move in depending on your sub-group of Marching Mizzou, either Saturday, Sunday, or Monday, August 16-18. Further information about this move-in process can be found on page 18 of this newsletter.

Band Camp is **REQUIRED** for participation in Marching Mizzou so please read the Band Camp schedule carefully and prepare yourself accordingly for all scheduled events that week. Please indicate on the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) if you are marching with DCI (Drum Corps International) this summer so we can note that and plan for your potential late arrival once your final responsibilities with your associated corps conclude. All members are expected to be in attendance **as soon as possible** following the completion of their responsibilities with DCI, although with our schedule this year all responsibilities should be complete by the time our band camp begins.

If you are participating in **PHA Recruitment**, which runs concurrently with our Band Camp, we will work with you to balance your responsibilities with both PHA Recruitment and Marching Mizzou. Please indicate on your [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) if you are participating in PHA Recruitment.

Note Marching Mizzou is an academic class that requires considerations over non-academic activities; however, we feel involvement in Greek Life is important and adds to the overall college experience. We will continue to work with you throughout the week, so you are able to balance both items in a healthy manner, but when in the academic semester, Marching Mizzou must take priority over your non-academic activities related to Greek Life.

Marching Mizzou Health and Safety Series

As you think ahead to your band camp arrival, please prepare yourself for what will likely be another hot and humid mid-Missouri summer. If you will be working or residing indoors for most of your time this summer, you need to acclimate yourself to the Missouri heat and humidity so please spend some time outdoors in the weeks leading up to Band Camp. Marching Mizzou Summer Exercise Competition

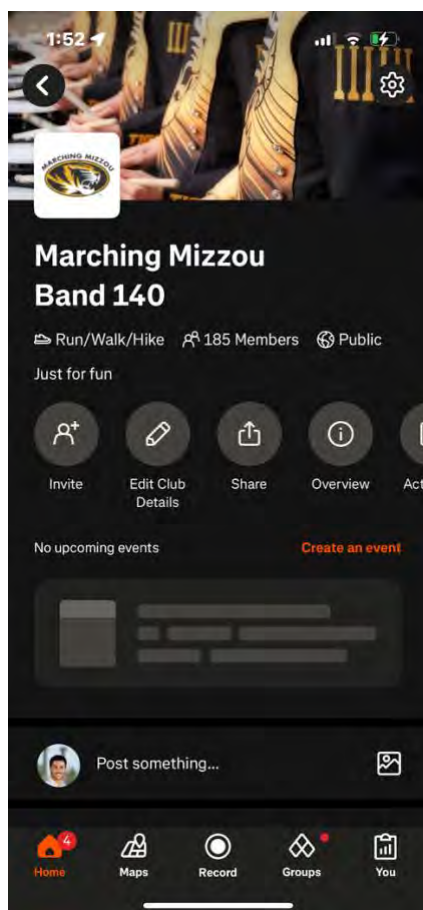
In its second year our Marching Mizzou Health and Wellness Committee stands ready to assist you in your preparation for not only band camp, but our entire season that extends all the way through the end of next June and our performances during [London Band Week](#).

The Marching Mizzou Summer Exercise Competition or “SEC” will help you diversify your health, wellness, and fitness options. Like last year, this comes with a section challenge element that ties into our annual Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Week and Cup Competition, so please see the message below from Hannah and Mina:

Hello, Marching Mizzou!

We are so excited to progress into our second year of the Marching Mizzou Health and Wellness Committee! Our committee’s mission and hope are to provide you all with information and activities about maintaining and improving mental, emotional, and physical health as participants of the collegiate marching arts. We have new ideas for this season, but first we will be moving forward with the competition we held last summer on [Strava](#), but with a new name – Summer Exercise Competition or “SEC” in honor of our conference, the SEC.

It is important for us as individuals and an ensemble to be prepared for Band 140, physically and mentally. This preparation needs to begin before band camp so that we can be in the best possible shape for our season, especially because we have five back-to-back home games to kick off our Mizzou Football season. Although not everyone finds exercise fun, we have created some motivation to join our Summer Exercise Competition: spirit cup points. This contest gives your section the chance to earn points towards the Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Week and Cup Competition before band camp even starts!



Timeline and Point System

The Summer Cardio Competition will take place over eleven weeks, with the first week, **June 1st to June 7th**, being a test week, and the last being the week prior to band camp. The test week will not contribute points to the overall competition. This week will be a practice week, so that we as a Health and Wellness Committee can determine that the outline of this competition is clear, fair, and the systems we have set in place work according to our plan and so you all that aren't as familiar with [Strava](#) have a chance to navigate through it at your own pace. In this first week, we would still like to see members completing the challenges listed below.

The first day of awarding points will be **June 8th**; the last day will be **August 16th**. The contest will be monitored through the [Strava](#) App on mobile phones. [Strava](#) is free to download, although it does have an option to upgrade at a cost, the upgrade is not necessary, and the competition can be completed with the free version of the app. [Strava](#) functions like social media in that you make a post after doing an exercise. In the "Activities" section of the club, it will show what other members of the club have been doing to be active. As established by the Recruitment and Outreach committee, the fairest way to assign points will be based on the percentage of participation of each section. The competition week will be from each Sunday to each Saturday. At the end of each day, the committee will record the number of people per section who completed the full challenge, then divide that by the total number of members in their section, and points will be awarded based on the following table. (Percentages will be rounded to the nearest whole number.) At the end of the 11 weeks, the top 5 sections with the most points will earn points towards the band camp spirit cup! An example of the point system is included below the tables.

Percentage and Point Tables

The more members who complete the challenge daily, the more points earned! We encourage members to complete the challenge every day that they feel able.

At the end of each week, the points from each day of that week will be totaled in a document and verified by section leaders. Of course, any issues will be handled fairly to the best of our ability.

Example of Point System

7/10 section members completed the challenge → 70% → 7 points added to your total!

Weekly Challenges

Every week will include a designated amount of cardio and weight training of your choice. You must do one of these activities to successfully complete the challenge. We are more than happy to see you surpass the required time for a challenge, but no extra points will be rewarded if you choose to do so. With each week of this friendly competition, we will increase the intensity by the time required of a challenge. You can do any of the cardio or weight training options available to log your workout which must be visible in our club's "Activities" section to be counted as a completion.

10 (Aug 10-16)	30 minutes of cardio or 1hr of weight training

Competition Rules

Work

Under no circumstances should you record yourself at work and label it as exercise. This will not count towards the points during the SEC, as we encourage members to carve out time in their day to only focus on their fitness.

Location/Map Appearance on Submission Posts

To verify honesty of participation, we ask that members submit their **CARDIO** posts with maps of your route included. This should be an option upon submitting your exercise if you record on [Strava](#), however if this is not working, please submit a picture of fitness tracking device (e.g. Garmin Watch, Apple Watch, Fitbit, etc.) to verify the exercise was completed. If neither of these are working/you do not own a tracking device **AND** your maps are not working, please reach out to Hannah Wehrman or Mina Giurgius (contact info below).

Acceptable Workouts - Feel free to utilize the [FITNESS](#) playlist!

- Cardio: running, walking, swimming, biking, cardio machines, HIIT (High Intensity Interval Training), sports
- Weight Training: free weights, weight machines, body weight exercises (Cross fit or calisthenics)

Cheating Policy

Cheating is **STRICTLY** prohibited in the SEC for Marching Mizzou Band 140. If **ANY** member is caught cheating (e.g. driving their car around to make it look like they are walking, setting a timer and say they are exercising with no location or proof of exercise, submitting a screenshot of a previous days' workout, etc.) will result in their **SECTION** being disqualified for that week. If this occurs 3 times (from one individual or multiple in one section), the section in which cheating occurred will be **DISQUALIFIED** from the competition, and no points will be rewarded to that respective section. If you are unsure if something is allowed, whether by you or your peers, we encourage you to report this to Hannah or Mina directly, otherwise follow the rules and hold you and your peers accountable!

How to log activity on the [Strava](#) App

1. Open the [Strava](#) App
2. Hit "record" in the center of the bottom task bar
3. Hit "start"
4. Do your activity
5. Hit "finish" to complete the workout
6. Type your **activity** in the title bar
7. Type your **section** in the "How'd it go?" box so we can assign points accordingly!
8. Click the dropdown menu and select what exercise you did for cardio **OR** for weight training.
9. Hit "save activity" to post your completed workout

Please note that if you do not include your section in your post description or title, we will not be counting your workout towards your section's points.

We will give a **30 seconds-1 minute** grace below the required time for a workout. For example, → Required: 30 min exercise; Performed 29 minutes 26 seconds → you will still receive points, but do not abuse it!

All **Returning Members** may move into their Residence Hall either Sunday, August 17 or Monday, August 18. We strongly recommend all Returning Members select a move-in slot prior to camp registration at 1:00 PM on Monday, August 18. You will go directly to your assigned residence hall at your selected move-in time slot. Residential Life will have volunteers and staff available to assist with early move-in only on Saturday, August 16.

The Residential Life housing portal will open July 1. **Please submit your [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) by June 20.** This will allow us time to communicate your early move-in request to Residential Life for your individual registration portal to be updated with early move-in options as soon as the housing portal opens. If somehow when you attempt to register all slots are filled or if you have any issues with this early move-in process, please let us know by emailing mubands@missouri.edu.

We will continue to send new registrations weekly on Tuesday mornings until July 29 so your Residential Life registration portal can be updated with early move-in times by Wednesday. If you complete the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) after the Residential Life housing portal opens, you will need to wait until Wednesday of the following week to register through Residential Life for an early move-in slot. **Your [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) must be submitted NO LATER than Monday, July 28** for us to arrange early move-in with Residential Life. As a reminder, if you do not complete your [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) with this information, we cannot reserve and subsidize your early residence hall move-in.

The cost for early move-in is \$40/night and will initially be billed to your student account. By October 15, this charge will automatically be refunded to your account by Marching Mizzou.

University-Owned Instruments

Every instrumentalist in Marching Mizzou will be provided with a university-owned instrument and one pair of black practice gloves that alto saxophone, tenor saxophone, and brass members are required to wear at all rehearsals.

Woodwind and brass members ***are allowed*** and encouraged to utilize their own instrument, especially clarinets, instead of one issued to them; however, the instrument must match the instrument provided by University Bands. For example, only silver instruments are used, except for black clarinets. Marching Mizzou is **NOT** responsible for cleaning, refurbishing, or replacing your personal instrument so you utilize it at your own risk. If you choose to utilize your own instrument you will be required to wear practice gloves at rehearsal.

After exhausting your provided pair of gloves, students must purchase replacement black gloves via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#). In addition, Marching Mizzou does **NOT** furnish nor sell reeds, valve oil, or grease, so please come prepared with those items as needed for your instrument.

This summer all instruments have been professionally cleaned. **To reserve an instrument please indicate what you need on the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#)**. If you need to adjust your registration form, please email us at mubands@missouri.edu. You do **NOT** need to fill out a separate School of Music Instrument Request Form as all your information has been captured in our [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#).

In preparation for our season, you will work ahead with your section leaders to complete Part Placement Auditions as well as work on our Traditional Music that we perform during Pregame and throughout any Marching Mizzou performance:

This music will also be available on our Marching Mizzou course “Canvas” page in addition to halftime and stands tune music as it comes available throughout the summer prior to the start of band camp. You again will gain access to this site when you register for the course and when it is published on or before **July 1**.

Woodwind and brass members please be thinking about which part, if applicable, will best fit your playing ability and communicate this to your respective Section Leaders. Returning members, you may be assigned to the same part as last season, but may be asked to move to a new part to help balance the section. Your Section Leaders will communicate with your section the requirements of your part placement audition that will be due to them by **June 15**.

By **July 1** Part Placement Adjudication, completed by Section Leaders, will be finished, all parts will be assigned, the Marching Mizzou Canvas Page for Band 140 will be live, and the Summer Memorization Assignment Calendar will begin as outlined below:

New Members, as you complete course registration during Summer Welcome you may inquire if an instrument owned by Marching Mizzou is available for you to check out and pick up while you are on campus. Please email us at mubands@missouri.edu to inquire and arrange if possible. Note our instruments are being cleaned over the summer so availability may be limited at first until more of our instruments are returned to our inventory. Returning Members may utilize the same system if you will be on campus at some point this summer.

This Summer Memorization Assignment process will be critical to our preparation for our performance at five home football games in a row to start the season. We encourage you all to dedicate yourselves now to this schedule and complete these assignments, so you set yourself up for success and less stress come August.

To provide additional inspiration to complete these Summer Memorization Assignments the Musicianship Committee has partnered with the Recruitment and Outreach Committee and our Tau Beta Sigma Uniform Chairs to create an award system of not only extra Marching Mizzou Band Camp Spirit Cup Points, but to determine the order of uniform fitting during band camp.

The day after each due date our Marching Mizzou Leadership Team will communicate to Drum Major Ava Lairmore, Chair of the Musicianship Committee, the total percentage of completion from their respective section. For example, if all four Drum Majors completed their Summer Memorization Assignment, then the percentage would be 100%. Below is the outline of points earned per percentage:

Once the final Summer Memorization Assignment has been completed, all points will be totaled and that will determine the order of uniform fitting during band camp.

Marching Mizzou Cost Coverage & Ultimate Drill Book and Beam Application Use

Marching Mizzou covers the cost of your instruments/equipment, one pair of black practice gloves, one pair of black performance gloves, music, and access to music and drill charts (via the [Ultimate Drill Book App](#)), game day meals, uniform cleaning costs, official game travel, and our annual end of season Band Banquet. All members, however, must purchase their own marching shoes (\$50.00) (Winds and Drumline; Color Guard priced separately) **and any replacement clothing and equipment items that may be needed.** Students are financially responsible for any damaged or lost instruments, uniforms, and/or equipment.

Marching Mizzou memorizes all their music for performances along a parade route and on Faurot Field in Memorial Stadium. We do use music, however, in rehearsal when in preparation for our performances. All wind players will be issued equipment to hold their phone (like a lyre) at the beginning of the season along with their instrument. **If you do not have a smartphone for this application, a flip folder will be provided to you.**

These items are yours to keep for the duration of your time in Marching Mizzou, but if at any time you lose one of these items you must purchase a replacement item via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Returning Members will receive a new (same design) white t-shirt at **NO CHARGE**. The Marching Mizzou black polo, ball cap, winter hat, gold dri-fit t-shirt, water bottle, sunglasses, and ear plugs (required for all indoor rehearsals) have remained the same; therefore, you will not receive these new items, please bring these back with you to campus. You may, however, purchase these items if any of yours need to be replaced via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#). *New this year, we do have a new feminine cut rehearsal short, a biker short/performance legging short* so if you are interested in purchasing a pair of those, please be sure to complete the [Marching Mizzou Band Camp Registration Form](#) with needed sizes and for other replacement items **before** paying for these

items via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Ball caps (or visor in the event a hair accommodation is required) will be used in the stands during games and used as an official uniform piece; therefore, all ball caps **must be treated as part of your uniform** and remain with you during all performances. In the event of cold weather an official Marching Mizzou winter hat will be issued and utilized in the stands as an official uniform piece. Color Guard and Feature Twirlers, you will be issued a headband. It is required that all members (except Color Guard and Feature Twirlers) wear their Marching Mizzou official dri-fit t-shirt under their uniform at every performance to present a uniform appearance when uniform coats are removed.

Our “Casual Uniform” for Marching Mizzou consists of the Marching Mizzou black polo, ball cap, a pair of LONG khaki-colored shorts or pants (purchase on own), black belt (as needed), and Nike athletic shoes to be worn with **black ankle socks**. As discussed, this is to create a sharp, uniform look across the ensemble during performances, travel, etc. Alternatively, throughout the rest of the season in the event of extreme temperatures for the comfort and safety of our students, we utilize this uniform as an alternative to the formal Marching Mizzou uniform. We will wear this casual uniform right away at Concert on the Quad on **Sunday, August 24**, so please make sure you have purchased your **long khaki shorts AND black ankle socks AND a black belt** prior to the start of band camp.

Uniform Fitting, Check Out, and Shoes

Marching Mizzou Uniform fitting will first take place virtually again this year by our Tau Beta Sigma Uniform Chairs. This will allow us to assign uniforms in advance to minimize the time of the in-person fitting process.

If you are a new woodwind, brass, or drumline member, or a Returning Member who has changed sizes, please complete the following Google Form so our Uniform Chairs may collect your information and make an initial uniform assignment **as soon as possible**. Prior to filling out this Google Form, please watch **this video** so you can complete your measurements correctly.

Once all assignments have been completed, we will utilize a uniform fitting schedule so members may try on their assigned uniform. If any adjustments need to be made to your assigned uniform, we will assign you an alternate uniform. In addition to your assigned uniform, all woodwind and brass players must wear black gloves (provided).

Marching Mizzou will continue to utilize the black “Super Drillmasters” that match our new uniforms and provide extended comfort to our members. To match the clean and sharp appearance of our uniforms and for uniformity across the ensemble, all wind and drumline members of Marching Mizzou must wear Super Drillmasters. The \$50.00 price has been made available exclusively to Marching Mizzou through Stanbury Uniforms (the manufacturer of our uniforms). New Members, if this was the shoe you utilized in a previous ensemble, and they are still in good condition you can continue to use them in Marching Mizzou. Note that all wind and drumline members must wear **long black athletic socks** (absolutely NO ankle socks nor long black athletic socks with **any** logos) with their band shoes. Please complete payment for these shoes via our [Marching Mizzou Uniform Store](#).

Parking at the Marching Mizzou Practice Field

All members and staff of Marching Mizzou must ensure their car is properly registered with Parking and Transportation Services (Turner Avenue Garage, Level 2, 882-4568).

Dr. Zambito has worked with Parking and Transportation to secure more parking spaces in the areas adjacent to the Marching Mizzou Practice Field. We are still permitted to use spillover lot across from Champions Drive if our Lot N and Little N is full.

If you live **on campus** and plan to purchase a permit to park on campus overnight as a resident student, you will need to provide Marching Mizzou with car information to allow you to park in the lots adjacent to our Marching Mizzou Practice Field.

If you plan to live **off campus** and need to park at the band field just for practice, you will be able to do so by purchasing a Fall 2025 Permit.

There is no plan by Parking and Transportation to ticket during Band Camp so you can park in our lots, as well as the Turner Avenue Parking Garage, without violation.

For Game Days one carpool will be provided a Lot N parking pass free of charge from Mizzou Athletics. The Hearn Center bus stop is very close to the Marching Mizzou Practice Field so students can utilize that to transition to the field. There are also bike racks available adjacent to our Marching Mizzou storage shed for use if students choose to ride their bike.

Mini Mizzou

Mini Mizzou represents the absolute best instrumentalists from Marching Mizzou. It is the athletic pep band that performs at selected away football games, all home men's and women's basketball games as well as select home volleyball matches, in addition to post season travel at the SEC and NCAA levels for all three teams, and various other athletic and campus events as requested and approved by Dr. Amy M. Knopps, Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands. All travel is paid for by the University of Missouri or the NCAA.

Mini Mizzou is split evenly to form the Mini Mizzou Black Band and the Mini Mizzou Gold Band that rotates performance responsibilities for Away Games for Football, Volleyball, Men's Basketball and Women's Basketball, as well as other campus and community events.

Membership is open to all members of Marching Mizzou, regardless of seniority or experience. **Video auditions for Mini Mizzou** will consist of "Fight Tiger" (memorized) and "Give a Cheer" and due to Dr. Knopps by **Friday, August 29** at the end of the first week of classes. Every member is strongly encouraged to audition for this special group, even if just for substitute consideration. Drum set auditions will be facilitated by Dr. Zambito, Assistant Director of Athletic Bands, and require additional audition material which he will outline to all interested candidates during band camp.

In June 2026, Marching Mizzou will proudly represent the University of Missouri and the United States as an invited ensemble at [London Band Week](#), a prestigious, invitation-only international celebration of musical excellence. Marching Mizzou will march in the Palace Parade Review through the King's Garden at London's historic Hampton Court Palace, a breathtaking setting steeped in royal tradition.

Drumlines will take center stage as they compete for the King's Shield at the high-energy DrumLine London: The Battle of the Flower Pot Gate, a crowd-favorite showdown that showcases skills, style and rhythm.

Throughout the week, we will be immersed in the pomp and pageantry for which London is famous, with meaningful opportunities to connect with the culture and traditions of our unique marching band heritage.

From the Columns to the Crown, Marching Mizzou is ready to roar in London, and you could be part of it.

This unique trip to [London Band Week](#), that will span from **Monday, June 22 – Monday, June 29, 2026**, is not a requirement for participation in Band 140 of Marching Mizzou this fall; however, it is highly, highly encouraged as it is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for you and an experience that you will remember for the rest of your life as we represent Mizzou on a global stage.

The culture of London is deeply rooted in the arts, history and vibrant public life, and music is at its heart. London is alive with sound, rhythm and tradition. From iconic military bands performing ceremonial duties at Buckingham Palace to a vast and diverse network of community bands found in nearly every borough, London truly is a global home for the marching band.

This city offers the chance to experience firsthand the rich musical heritage that has shaped both British and American traditions. In London, music isn't just heard, it's celebrated, in royal parades, historic festivals and neighborhood streets. It's a destination where Marching Mizzou can honor our roots, engage in meaningful exchange and inspire new generations by sharing our uniquely American spirit of performance.

As an ensemble passionate about the marching arts, we will thrive in this immersive experience that celebrates the traditions and innovations of bands from around the world. With large-scale performances, parades, educational workshops and international collaboration, this program offers unique opportunities for musical growth, leadership development and cultural engagement.

Our Marching Mizzou trip to [London Band Week](#) will function as a "Study Abroad Program" under the Office of International Programs at the University of Missouri. Students can participate in this trip as a Study Abroad program and a course for credit or they may participate in the trip for no additional credit. Our trip and enrollment in MUS_GENL 4005-02: Topics in Humanities is coordinated by Paulina Brouder in the Office of International Programs. Every student enrolled will receive a letter grade that becomes a part of their permanent university record.

Breakfast Provided – Lunch and Dinner on Own

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher, you will walk to Buckingham Palace for the Changing of the King’s Guard. This ceremony is supported by one of His Majesty’s Guard Bands.

While in this “Ceremonial London” area, it is recommended to also consider seeing the Admiralty Arch, Whitehall, Horse Guards Parade, Downing Street, The Mall, Palace of Westminster (Big Ben) and Westminster Abbey.

Lunch on own follows, then tap your Oyster Card (provided) to take the Underground to the Tower of London to view the Crown Jewels and Coronation Sword. In this “City of London” area it is recommended to also consider seeing The Monument, Bank of England, The Guildhall, Mansion House, and Leadenhall Market.

Situated along the River Thames in central London, this historic fortress has a rich and often dark history. Built by William the Conqueror in 1066, it has served as a royal palace, prison, and treasury. Its iconic White Tower is the central structure and displays an impressive collection of armor, weaponry, and the Crown Jewels. The Tower’s guardian, the Yeomen Warders (Beefeaters), adds to its unique charm.

We will finish at The Tower of London at approximately 5:00 PM so there will be an evening theatre opportunity (tickets purchased on own) or leisure time at Coal Drops Yard, Canary Warf, or Camden. Dinner is own your own.

Thursday, June 25, 2026 – Marching Mizzou “Live in London” at Potters Fields Park Across from the Tower Bridge
Breakfast and Dinner Provided – Lunch on Own

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher, there will be a brief amount of time in the morning to potentially go to a museum such as the Victoria and Albert, Natural History, Science Museum, Imperial War, or The Design Museum before we prepare for our afternoon performance at Potters Fields Park Across from the Tower Bridge. Lunch will be on your own.

Once our performance has concluded there will be additional sightseeing options, and your London Band Week Survival Guide will suggest a sightseeing loop of St. Paul’s Cathedral, South Bank, Borough Market, and Shad Thames.

We will finish “Live in London” at approximately 6:00 PM. Dinner will be provided, then there will be an opportunity or leisure time at Coal Drops Yard, Canary Warf, or Camden, and a *potential* to see an evening show (tickets purchased on own).

Friday, June 26, 2026 – Excursion to Windsor Castle
Breakfast and Dinner Provided – Lunch on Own

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher, board the chartered motorcoach. We will depart London in the early morning at approximately 8:00 AM for Royal Windsor Berkshire.

Windsor Castle is one of the oldest and largest inhabited castles in the world. Built in the 11th century, it has been a royal residence for over 1,000 years and is best known as having been the favored residence of Queen Elizabeth II. We will take a guided tour of the Castle, including the State Apartments and St. George’s Castle, then enjoy lunch on own and free time to explore this charming British town.

Our estimated time of arrival back from Windsor is approximately 3:00 PM. Due to this arrival time back in London, there will be evening theatre opportunity (tickets purchased on own) or leisure time at Coal Drops Yard, Canary Warf, or Camden. Dinner will be provided via a meal voucher for local fish and chips.

Another option would be to attend the Museum late hours at the National Gallery or the British Museum.

Saturday, June 27, 2026 – Marching Mizzou Live at the London ExCeL for The London Tattoo
Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner Provided

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher we will depart via the tube for the London ExCeL where we will be in rehearsals and preparation throughout the day for The London Tattoo performance in the evening. Both lunch and dinner will be at the London ExCeL during rehearsal breaks.

We will finish “The London Tattoo” at approximately 9:00 PM so our ETA back into the city is 10:00 PM.

Sunday, June 28, 2026 – Excursion to Hampton Court Palace – Marching Mizzou Live in London for the Palace Parade Review and DrumLine London, and Marching Mizzou Thames River Cruise
Breakfast, Dinner, and Lunch Provided

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher, we will depart for London’s Historic Royal Palace, Hampton Court via a chartered motorcoach.

One of King Henry VIII's favored residences, Hampton Court is a splendid Tudor palace and a prime example of English Baroque architecture. Renowned for its intricate Tudor and Baroque design elements, the palace boasts stunning architecture, magnificent gardens, and the famous Hampton Court Maze.

Upon arrival we will complete a short walk through the palace grounds to the private Garden Room for our event registration. You will have access to an early lunch before the Palace Parade Review and DrumLine London: The Battle of Flower Pot Gate. Once the event concludes there will be additional time to explore the palace grounds before we head back to London and our hotel to change and freshen up.

Our last evening in London will be spent on our Marching Mizzou Thames River Cruise. The cruise will set sail at 7:00 PM and dock at 10:00 PM, so there will be ample time to capture fantastic views of London from the deck.

Monday, June 29, 2026 - London to Columbia - Travel Day

Breakfast Provided - Lunch and Dinner Details Pending Until Flight Schedule is Known

After getting breakfast in the neighborhood with your breakfast voucher, we will load our buses and head to London Heathrow Airport, accompanied by the London Band Week Liaison Officers and Staff for departure home to the United States. We will clear US Customs and Immigration in London; therefore, we will require some extra time at London Heathrow Airport to complete this process before we depart.

Lunch will likely be provided on the afternoon flight to Chicago, IL (O'Hare). Once we arrive in Chicago, we will simply collect our bags from the baggage carousel and meet our buses for the return trip to Columbia.

Individual Student Cost, Payment Plan Through the University of Missouri, and Enrollment

The individual student travel cost of this nearly all-inclusive tour is **\$4,150** for land and air, and **\$2,850** for land only if additional travel in Europe is desired either before or after our official trip begins and ends, due to the summer session.

In addition to the above cost the Office of International programs also assess two fees, one is an Administrative Fee of \$245 and the other is a \$43.70 mandatory health insurance fee. These are assessed to all Study Abroad programs. All students will have to secure their passport as well as a "UK ETA Visa," which is an electronic travel visa available via the "UK ETA" app.

Payment for Marching Mizzou's trip to [London Band Week](#) is subsidized completely by the student and coordinated through our Office of International Programs via your student account at the University of Missouri. Payment will be charged to the participating student's account two times to split the individual travel cost, half on **October 1, 2025**, and the remaining balance on **January 15, 2026**.
