Graduate Teaching Assistantship in Saxophone



The MU School of Music offers graduate assistantships to qualified master of music and doctoral students. The **Saxophone** teaching assistantship is a **quarter-time** appointment (**10hrs per week**) with an anticipated stipend of **\$9,089**. This amount is paid to students over the nine months of the academic year.

In addition, tuition for coursework required for the degree is waived during the appointment period. This waiver covers both Missouri residents and non-residents at all levels. The latest information on tuition and fees may be found at <https://cashiers.missouri.edu/>.

Quarter-time assistantships also come with a **50% allowance for health insurance**.

Applicants may qualify for assistantships in other areas as well. Please email the School of Music (music@missouri.edu) for available assistantships.

Duties may include

Teaching lessons; performing in and/or coaching a saxophone quartet; assisting with the Mizzou Saxophone Ensemble; providing administrative support for the saxophone studio (equipment inventory, library, etc.); teaching the saxophone portion of the woodwind methods class.
