In support of this effort, the University of Missouri System has several safeguards in place to ensure that our youth programs provide an enriching and rewarding experience. Part of our ongoing commitment also means that we want to be notified of any concerning behavior. If you have any concerns about the safety of your child, or any youth participant, or want to make a report of suspected inappropriate behavior on the part of an individual involved with a youth program, we encourage that you report that information so we can act immediately. Information about how you can make a report is outlined below.

At any time during your child's involvement with your chosen youth program, please feel free to reach out to Youth Program Representative at the contact information listed below with questions you might have about safety protocols that are in place at University of Missouri System universities.

## Information about how you can make a report

- 1. If you believe the situation is an emergency, please contact 911.
- 2. If you believe that the situation involves criminal behavior, we encourage you to contact the university police department or local law enforcement agency where the youth program is taking place.
- 3. In addition to contacting law enforcement, or if you do not choose to make a report to law enforcement, we encourage you to make a report of your concerns in the following way(s):
  - a. Report your concerns to the coordinator of the youth program in which your child is participating.
  - b. Report your concerns to the Title IX and Equity Office at the appropriate university of the University of Missouri System.
