## ABOUT THE COMPOSER

John E. Cheetham, Professor Emeritus of Music Theory and Composition at the University of Missouri-Columbia, was born in Taos, New Mexico in 1939. He received his Bachelor and Master's degrees from the University of New Mexico in 1962 and 1965, and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Composition from the University of Washington in 1969.

During his tenure at Missouri from 1969 to 2000, he has written compositions for virtually all media and his works have been widely performed in the United States and abroad. Much of his music has been published commercially and since 2001, through his own publishing firm, BoonesLick Press. Recordings of many of his works are available on Antara, Crystal, Cedille, Concord, Pro-Arte, Mark, Summit and NPR Classic labels.

Since retirement, Cheetham has been prolific as a composer completing nearly 50 new works. He is often heard boasting "since retirement in 2000, I have become a full-time composer for the first time in my life." During that time he has received numerous commissions and has remained an active member of ASCAP.
