Performer Biographies:

Maya Anand, soprano, is a junior at the University of Missouri originally from Saint Louis, Missouri. She is currently pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Music and a Bachelor of Journalism. Recent performances include flower girl/chorus member in Landlocked Opera's *Le nozze di Figaro* and Tytania cover in Show-Me Opera's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Maya studies voice with Christina Ray and has previously studied Indian classical voice, giving several concerts in her hometown and in cities across India. Maya is also a violinist and plays in the MU Philharmonic Orchestra

Tara Boydston, Mezzo-Soprano, is from Kansas City, Missouri. She is a senior attending the University of Missouri for Vocal Performance and Psychology, studying under Prof. Christine Seitz. She is set to graduate with both degrees in the spring of 2024. She was also a member of MU's University Singers for more than 5 years, with director Paul R. Crabb, as well as the Show-Me Opera program. She has sung many roles, including Hermia from Britten's *Midsummer Night's Dream*, Marcellina from Mozart's *Le nozze di Figaro*, and Bradamante from Handel's *Alcina*. She has also done solo work including "Efteraaslied" by Hans Abrahmsen with the Mizzou New Music Ensemble, and Mozart's *Requiem* Movement IV: Domine Jesu performed at St. Stevens in Vienna, Austria. She also qualified as a semi-finalist in the NATS regional competition in her freshman and sophomore year.

Emmaline Brown, alto, is a freshman at the University of Missouri, majoring in Vocal Performance. Emmaline comes from Pacific, MO, and is currently a member of the University of Missouri's University Singers and Show-Me Opera. She studies voice under Professor Christina Ray, and has taken voice lessons for three years; first, under Amy Gatsenberger, and later, Doctor Philip A. Woodmore. Emmaline has received multiple Exemplary "1" ratings on her solos and ensembles at MSHSAA Music Festivals at the district and state levels.

Ivan Carmona, baritone, is from Coral Springs, FL and is pursuing a B.M. in Music Education as junior at The University of Missouri, Columbia. Ivan has been in A Capella groups such as Vocal Point, Cantmos, and Troubadours. He has also played lead rolls in Opera Scenes such as Papageno in *The Magic Flute*, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Maximiliano in *Candide* by Leonard Bernstein. He also was the lead singer and cofounder of the folk-rock band Fienix & Pixie from 2012 – 2020.

Elise Cressey, soprano, is from Kansas City, Missouri and is a transfer student at the University of Missouri. She is pursuing a BA in music, as well as double majoring in Communications with a minor in Psychology. She is studying voice with Christina Ray and has also performed in a variety of shows. Since attending Mizzou, she has participated in University Singers, the university's Bach Collegium Choir, Canticum Novum, and Show-Me Opera. She has competed in NATS throughout college, most recently competing at Mid-MO NATS receiving first place for solo repertoire.

Ludwing Espindola is from Saltillo, Coahuila, Mexico, where he has performed in different recitals as a soloist and collaborative pianist. In 2018 he participated in the 6th Edition of the National and International Piano competition "José Jacinto Cuevas" Yamaha. In 2021, Ludwing graduated with a bachelor's degree in piano performance at Universidad Autonoma de Coahuila. In 2022 he won Honorable Mention in the graduate division of the MMTA Collegiate Honors Auditions. During the last academic year he performed as one of the pianists of the Mizzou New Music Ensemble. He now continues his graduate studies in piano performance under Dr. Miyamoto at the University of Missouri where he is a graduate research assistant, teaching applied students and performing as pianist for the Show-Me Opera and the Concert Chorale.

Ja'wan Footman is a dynamic and exceptionally talented performer who has enchanted audiences with his remarkable skills and charismatic stage presence. Born on February 18, 2000, in Orangeburg, South Carolina, Ja'wan is the proud son of Virginia Charley and Derrick Footman. His journey in the world of performing

arts has been nothing short of inspiring. Ja'wan's pursuit of excellence led him to Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU), where he dedicated himself to the art of music and voice performance. At FAMU, he earned his Bachelor's of Science in Music with a specialization in Voice Performance. During his time at the university. Ja'wan had the privilege of participating in a wide range of operatic scenes, including renowned productions like Carmen and Die Zauberflöte (The Magic Flute). He also took part in operatic scenes at Florida State University, further enriching his experience. One of Ja'wan's notable roles was as the Bass Section Leader for the Florida A&M University Concert Choir. His leadership played a pivotal role in guiding the choir to extraordinary achievements, including performances at the Florida Music Educators Association (FMEA), NFL events, and even a historic performance at Carnegie Hall. Ja'wan's commitment to his craft and his dedication to furthering his knowledge and skills have led him to attend prestigious events such as the Music and Medicine Symposium, Choral Music of African American Composers, Lectures, and Conductors Symposium. He also took part in the Soloist for CAPPA (Coalition of African American in the Performing Arts) Workshop, where he served as the lead singer in a vocal master class. Ja'wan's exceptional talents have garnered recognition, including nominations for the Collegiate Honors Choir Performance at Carnegie Hall and a nomination to perform a solo at the Alabama HBCU ACDA. Currently, Ja'wan Footman continues his artistic journey at the University of Missouri, where he is studying under the guidance of Professor Kyle Stegall and Dr. Brandon Boyd as he pursues his Master's in Voice Performance. His unwavering dedication, boundless talent, and passion for the arts continue to set him on a path toward a bright and promising future in the world of entertainment.

Grace Gard, soprano, is from Lee's Summit, Missouri and is currently a Sophomore at the University of Missouri. They are pursuing a Bachelor of Music in Choral Education. Grace studies voice with Christine Seitz and is a member of the Show Me Opera, also under the direction of Professor Seitz. They have performed the roles of Taylor McKessie in *High School Musical*, Mrs. Mayor in *Seussical*, and The Percussion Fish in *Spongebob The Musical*. Grace is a two-year member of the Missouri All-State choir, and they have received superior "I" or "Gold" ratings on all of their solos at the district and state level.

Aidan Gildehaus (he/him) is a baritone from St. Louis Missouri. He is currently a freshman at the University of Missouri, majoring in Political Science-Pre Law and Vocal Performance, and studying voice under Prof. Kyle Stegall. Previous credits include The Baker (*Into the Woods, FHS*), Sheriff Schmid/Preacher u/s (*Bonnie and Clyde, GCPA*), and The Snail (*Frog and Toad, FNT*). Aidan recently won first place in the lower undergraduate lower voice Musical Theatre category at the 2023 Central Region NATS Competition. Other vocal honors include Missouri All-State Choir (2022 and 2023), the Missouri State and District Music Festival (Gold Ratings). In addition, Aidan has received the Ambassadors of Harmony Vocal Scholarship, the Wanda Simpson Vocal Scholarship, and a Talent Scholarship from the School of Music at MU. Sopranist **Lucas Gonzaga** is from São Paulo, Brazil. Gonzaga is currently a graduate student and teaching assistant in the voice area at the University of Missouri. He holds a BA in Music Education and is pursuing a Master of Music in vocal performance, studying with Prof. Steven Tharp. Gonzaga is a former harpist at the São Paulo State Youth Orchestra as well as a former singer at the Academic Choir of the São Paulo State Symphony Orchestra (OSESP), where he sang in the soprano section. In the spring of 2023, he won the University of Missouri – School of Music's Emerging Artists Competition and Concerto Competition, as well as performing as Oberon in Benjamin Britten's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* with Show-Me-Opera, under the direction of Prof. Christine Seitz. Lucas recently won second place in the graduate upper voice Classical category at the 2023 Central Region NATS Competition.

Over the course of their high school career, Jack has been a member of the Metro 8 all-district choir 3 times and has been a member of the Missouri all-state choir twice. She has performed as solo soprano in the Farnham and Byas' Playhouse production of Handel's *Messiah*, and has performed arias in the Show-Me Opera Scenes performances, including Linda from Donizetti's *Linda di Chamounix* and Olympia from Offenbach's *The Tales of Hoffmann*. Recently, Wendy had the opportunity to perform the role of Tytania in Benjamin Britten's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* with the University of Missouri Show-Me Opera.

Vaysia Knust, soprano, is a Junior at the University of Missouri Columbia where she studies Vocal Performance under Professor Christine Seitz. Vaysia has participated in many choirs at Mizzou but is currently a part of University Singers, Hitt Street Harmony and the School of Music's outreach choir.
