Tara Boydston, mezzo-soprano, is from Kansas City, Missouri. She is a senior attending the University of Missouri for Vocal Performance and Psychology, studying under Prof. Christine Seitz. She is set to graduate with both degrees in the spring of 2024. She was also a member of MU's University Singers for more than 5 years, with director Paul R. Crabb, as well as the Show-Me Opera program. She has sung many roles, including Hermia from Britten's *Midsummer Night's Dream*, Marcellina from Mozart's *Le nozze di Figaro*, and Bradamante from Handel's *Alcina*. She has also done solo work including "Efterasslied" by Hans Abrahmsen with the Mizzou New Music Ensemble, and Mozart's *Requiem* Movement IV: Domine Jesu performed at St. Stevens in Vienna, Austria. She also qualified as a semi-finalist in the NATS regional competition in her freshman and sophomore year.

Erin Brage, mezzo-soprano, is from Kansas City, Missouri. She is a sophomore at Mizzou studying Business Administration and Music with an emphasis in Vocal Performance. During her studies, she has been involved in University Singers, Show-Me Opera, staged arias, Canticum Novum Chamber Choir, and Ars Nova. She has been taking voice lessons from Professor Christina Ray since 2022 and from Jill Hemann prior to college.
