## Biographies

She has been singing since she was very young and is currently studying under Prof. Christina Ray. She has played some roles in the school's recent opera productions such as Carmen from *Carmen*, Auntie from *Peter Grimes*, Tisbe from *La Cenerentola*, and a cover for the role of Dame Carruthers in the production of The *Yeomen of the Guard*.

**Madeleine Cerneka**, soprano, is a second year at the University of Missouri majoring in Vocal Music Education. She performed in her first opera, The *Yeomen of the Guard* in March 2025. Although she is new to opera, she is no stranger to the stage. Previous musical roles include Whitney/DA in *Legally Blonde* at The Little Theater of Jefferson City, as well as Donna in *Mamma Mia!* and Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz* at Fulton High School. She's also performed dramatic roles such as Hannah/Others in *Puffs* and Molly Ralston in Agatha Christie's *The Mousetrap* at Fulton High School.
